Submission:

Everyone is encouraged to create a shoebox diorama using marshmallow Peeps candy. Submit your diorama and detached entry form below to the Three Oaks Township Public Library between Tuesday, April 1, to Saturday, April 5, 2025. All ages are encouraged to participate but only one entry per person or group will be accepted. NOTE: All entries are due by 2:00 pm on Saturday, April 5, 2025.

Diorama Guidelines:

Dioramas can be submitted in any size shoebox or box of shoebox size. All the characters in your diorama must be Peeps (of any kind and flavor). You may use any other materials necessary to create costumes and to assemble your scene. The contents of your diorama must be secured in order to survive any necessary relocations within the library. Please include the title of your creation on the front of your diorama. All other personal information should be on your entry form. You may attend the Peeps Diorama Workshops on Tuesday, March 18, 6-8 pm or Thursday, March 27, 6-8 pm, but this is not required.



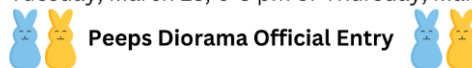
Display:
